**first Cathedral,** was the first Cathedral to be named in honor of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. The

Paulist Fathers were given Pastoral responsibilities of Old St. Mary's in 1894 and have faithfully ministered to the people of Chinatown, Nob Hill and the Financial District ever since. A Survivor of the 1906 earthquake and fire, this major historical landmark has been retrofitted to meet new seismic codes; however, we must now comply with the American Disability Act and refurbish the interior of this beautiful old

# PLEASE JOIN ME IN PRAYING FOR OUR AMERICAN BISHOPS! A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FATHER JOE SCOTT

I love Jesus and I love Pope Francis, but I'm worried about our American Catholic Bishops.

Let me explain why. Recently, Bishop Joseph Strickland of Tyler, Texas called Pope Francis "an idiot" and urged him to resign immediately. I find it difficult



to follow the words of a Catholic Bishop who publicly (or even privately) refers to the leader of the Church as "an idiot!"

I was hoping that the entire body of American Bishops would raise up in protest against one of their number speaking about Pope Francis in such contemptuous language. But to date, I have heard not a word in the Pope's defense!

The sad truth is that Bishop Strickland is not unique among American Bishops in their disdain for Pope Francis. More than few of our Bishops have publicly urged that the Bishop of Rome resign. The United States Catholic Conference has been extraordinarily slow in supporting the leadership of the Pope, in some cases working against his objectives for a more merciful Church.

How would a Catholic Bishop, let alone ANY Catholic, find the words to call the Pope an "idiot?" Is it possible that with some American Bishops, the views of enormously rich donors with invitations to luxurious Institutes, carry more import than does the Bishop of Rome?

Perhaps Pope Francis is seen as too nice of a guy! Some Popes, in past history, were able to win the allegiance of their Bishops through the ancient tools of power and fear. Pope Francis stresses the mercy and the love of Christ and gently urges to his Bishops to conversion and reform.

Perhaps it's easier for some Bishops to ignore, or in Bishop Strickland's case, to publicly ridicule the Pope, because they suspect that, as a good Christian, he will simply turn the other cheek, with no further consequences to them!

This October, Pope Francis will convene a Synod of the entire Church whose members will include lay men and women as well as Bishops, to make decisions will assist the pope in his responsibility to lead the Church. In 1962-965, the American Bishops made an enormous contribution to the work of the Second Vatican Council, in speaking for religious freedom and working to build bonds of friendship and love with the Jewish community. We, as the entire Church, are forever in their debt.

What contributions will our American Bishops make to the October Synod this year?

I wonder. And I worry.

And most especially, I'm trying to pray to the Holy Spirit each day, that our American Bishops may listen to that Holy Spirit of God's love and mercy and respond accordingly.
