## THE MARCH OF THE PENGUINS A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FR. JOE SCOTT



Some of you may remember a movie documentary a few years back called "March of the Penguins." It told the story of a community of penguins living in Antarctica. The movie revealed many fascinating details about the lives of these beautiful birds. But one scene I remember vividly. There came fierce blizzard, with high winds and way below freezing temperatures. This large community of penguins huddled together in a big circle as close to each other as they could get. Then something very striking happened. The penguin at the very center of the circle, where the wind was least and the temperature warmest, left that safe place and took a position at the very edge of the circle, where the cold winds were at their most fierce. Another penguin followed, and then another. The penguins who now stood on the outside made it a little easier for the ones just in front of them.

Each of the penguins sacrificed their own warmth so that the others could be a little warmer. It was clear the penguins did this by instinct. Instinct told them that it was more important for their species to survive than any individual. They all acted so that everyone would have a chance of survival.

I thought of that movie this week when I saw one of those many recent news stories about the first responders at the scene of a shooting. When the shooting broke out, everyone was trying to get away to safety as quickly as they could, as any of us would do in such circumstances.

But some ran not away, but towards the crowd, towards the bullets, to see if they could help. Some were police, some were fire fighters, some were medical personnel. Many, many of them were off duty, in fact far from their homes. But they put their own lives at risk in order to save whoever they could, probably someone they didn't even know.

I've always had great admiration for men and women who can do this. They are trained to do what they do but they choose that training because they want to help others. They value their own lives; they want to live and enjoy their lives but somehow, they believe that it's important to be there for those who may have no one else to help them. Their compassion for those in distress took precedence over their desire to preserve their life.

The gospels remember Jesus as someone who gave his life to save others, to save US. Perhaps the most important way to understand how Jesus could do this is that he refused to have an enemy. Jesus saw everyone, man and women, Jew or Samaritan, saint or sinner, everyone in his eyes was a child of God. And on the cross, even when he was reviled or abandoned by everyone he saw, everyone he knew, he chose to remain faithful not only to God, but to US.

One of the most universally loved saints is the Pope's namesake, Francis of Assisi. Francis' great insight is that no one is outside our family, not even the animals or the plants. We are brothers and sisters with the moon and the sun, with the Christian and the Muslim, with the poor and the sick.

To be a Christian is to be not a conqueror or exploiter of anyone, but a brother and sister to everyone. We are one, St. Francis taught us, with all creation. We can learn a lot from the penguins as we face the cold winds and setting suns of our own lives.
