WELCOME TO OLD SAINT MARY'S CATHEDRAL

JONAH

If I could pick one book from the Old Testament to read in these troubled times, I would pick Jonah. Jonah is the only one of the Jewish prophets that Jesus quotes more than Isaiah. Although it was written more than two thousand years ago, it tells us how we can follow Jesus today.

The first thing to know about Jonah is not historical fact. The only history in it is the name "Ninevah". It's what we call a short story. And it's also a satire, or comedy, we think of the Bible as a very serious book, and we tend to read it very seriously. But we won't really get the point of Jonah until we can laugh along with its author.

Jonah is like the late-night comedians we view on television, who talk about the serious issues of our time, in a way that we can laugh about them, and thereby view them in a new way.

What Jonah is trying to teach us is how to live with the people we truly hate. Who is your biggest enemy? For Jonah, it is the people of Ninevah, a powerful city whose citizens used their power advantage to oppress the poor and relatively powerless people of Israel.

So, when God calls for Jonah to preach to his worst enemy, Jonah flees in the opposite direction, as far away as can get. God must use a tremendous sea storm and a huge fish to get Jonah's attention.

Jonah finally goes to Ninevah, but all the time he's preaching to his enemies, he's certain his message will fail. And he WANTS it to fail. He believes that the Ninevites are so stupid and so evil they will reject God and Jonah's call to repent, and then God will destroy them with fire and brimstone. And the best thing will be that Jonah will have a front row seat for all this destruction.

Well, it turns out that there ARE some good people in Ninevah after all—lots of them. Do we ever think about the good people in Russia? Or about the good people in Cuba? Or about the good people in China? The book of Jonah tells us that Jonah was a much more effective prophet than he wanted to be. He convinces even the four-legged animals to repent in sack cloth and ashes.

The punchline in this story is that while ALL the Ninevites turn back to God and repent, Jonah himself does NOT repent. He's the only one in the story who ends up not trusting in the love and mercy of God.

The amusing thing is that God is taking good care of Jonah right until the end, even growing a large, shady plant for him to rest under in the hot desert. But Jonah can't feel grateful, because he's so angry at God for treating with forgiveness, and mercy, the very people Jonah hates, for treating Jonah's enemies just as well as he treats Jonah, no more and no less.

Jonah's comedy is very good for us because we may take ourselves, and our world, too seriously. Our daily news is full of hatreds and enemies. Jonah is too angry with God to appreciate the beauty of the shady plant God gives him. Much like Jonah, we spend too much time in fear and anger, and not enough in gratitude and mercy.

The book of Jonah leaves its angry prophet with a decision. Can he trust God's love enough to love ALL the people God loves, even the ones who don't seem so lovable? Jonah's decision is our decision too.

The best part about the story is that it has no ending. It's open-ended. We, you, and I, have to provide its ending!
