

OLD SAINT MARY'S, built in 1854 as California's first Cathedral, was the first Cathedral to be named in honor of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. The Paulist Fathers were given Pastoral responsibilities of Old St. Mary's in 1894 and have faithfully ministered to the people of Chinatown, Nob Hill and the Financial District ever since. A Survivor of the 1906 earthquake and fire, this major historical landmark has been retrofitted to



meet new seismic codes; however, we must now comply with the American Disability Act and refurbish the interior of this beautiful old cathedral. Notes from the Paulist



THE HOLY SPIRIT IS NOT A GHOST! A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FATHER JOE SCOTT

St. Luke likes to paint the most dramatic and positive scenes about the work of the gospel. The Pentecost story is a good example. Lots of fire and smoke and everyone overcoming their language differences and understanding each other as one. This is all well and good, but what does it have to do with what the Holy Spirit brings to you and me? Do we, can we, get excited about the Holy Spirit as do these disciples in Jerusalem?



One thing to remember is that the Holy Spirit is NOT a ghost. We gave up that language a long time ago, and for good reason. We can see, feel, and touch the Holy Spirit.

After all, the Holy Spirit is Jesus' Spirit. If we see Jesus, we are seeing his Holy Spirit at work. I like to think of the Holy Spirit as an energy, like wind or electricity. It's the energy of God's love. You see it by seeing its effects, which are evident in all of us. This Spirit energized Jesus to do the things that he did and to live the way that he lived. He invited us to take HIS energy and use it. We have it, as a gift. But like Mary with the angel Gabriel, we have to respond yes---or it doesn't go anywhere. If we don't use it we lose it. It's like tending a fire. It's like being in love. We start with little things—a poke at the embers, a note passed in a classroom. It starts small, but with attention it can grow into a vast energy.

Who of us is willing to give up our lives for someone we don't really know, let alone love? Not me. But Jesus did that. Someone in Jesus' name is doing it somewhere this day, every day. That's energy.

So if we're filled with the Holy Spirit of God's love, why is love so hard for us to do? In addition to the Holy Spirit, we have evil spirits. Evil spirits are not little green goblins. The most powerful evil spirits of our time are love of and greed for money, racism and hatred and contempt toward women. These evil spirits are powerful because so many of us assent to them. We think we can get by with six and one half days of meanness and only one hour in Church.

We hope we can play with the fire of hatred just for a while and not get burnt. It doesn't work that way. When Jesus received the Holy Spirit, the first thing he did was to say NO to the evil spirit he met in the desert. I don't know your evil spirit but I know mine. If we want to love as Jesus loved, we must say "no" to fear and self-pity and meanness. Only then can we truly say "yes" to love.

We can't see the Holy Spirit at work in our world until we give attention to the working of that Spirit in our own heart. We must make a decision to do something loving every day. We may find it easier to do something angry each day. Or something hateful each day. That's because we've been giving daily food to our evil spirits. Try giving daily food to the Holy Spirit of love in your heart.

We can nourish love by making a decision to see others as though with the eyes of Jesus. Start practicing this with the person you dislike the most. Do it every day.


