Paulist Fathers were given Pastoral responsibilities of Old St. Mary's in 1894 and have faithfully ministered to the people of Chinatown, Nob Hill and the Financial District ever since. A Survivor of the 1906 earthquake and fire, this major historical landmark has been retrofitted to meet new seismic codes; however, we must now comply with the American Disability Act and refurbish the interior of this beautiful old

RESTING: A REFLECTION ON ADVENT BY PAULIST FR. JOE SCOTT

Something to think about--in the Genesis story of creation, God works hard for six days. On each of the six days we witness God's creative power at work, shaping, and fastening from morning to evening.

Then on the seventh day God RESTS. Period. It's true, in the Book of Genesis, God expects human beings to take up the slack. He gives some directions, but he's not. there most of the time.

Where does God go? Where-ever God is, he's resting. He's resting and sometimes he's listening. People appeal their needs to God and expect to be answered, but they're not always satisfied by God's answers, or sense of timing.

Just think: you and I almost never have time to pray. Yet, when we're in trouble, at any time of the day or night, we expect God to be there, listening.

My question is: if God rests so much, why do we have to be so busy? When we hear heaven described as "eternal rest" or listen to the priest pray "rest in peace" we don't like it. We think of resting as being bored and boring.

We Americans have a voice inside saying, "don't be lazy." It helps us most of the time, but it can hurt us as well. God worked from 9 to 5, six days of the week, but then God took time off to savor his handiwork at leisure. A lot of us never think about taking a vacation or even a day off. We're afraid if we're not busy we'll miss something. But if we ARE busy, all the time, we miss our family and friends. We miss God.

To be frank, resting is necessary to love someone. When couples date, they spend plenty of leisure time together. They discover each other while having fun. After the vows are taken, it can seem like a lot of work. Couples who forget to rest with each other can forget to love. It takes practice and commitment to do nothing.

God not only rests, but God is also quiet. We talk a lot, and even our prayers are sometimes just talking, but God seldom talks. Instead, God knocks quietly on the door of our hearts. Most of the time, it's we who are too busy to answer.

What does God DO? God doesn't DO anything. God waits. God waits like the young woman expecting her first child.

God waits like the young child eagerly awaiting the coming of Santa. Because he's waiting, God has time to wait on us. He's eager to listen because each of us is part of his story. God waits for the time when the lowly will be raised up and the divided made one.

Can we survive in heaven if there's no work to do? If we need to rest to love, isn't loving what heaven is truly about? What if we had all the leisure, we needed to spent time with the people we truly love? What if EVERYONE turned out to be the people we truly love? That would be heaven!

This Advent--rest. Yes, November and December are the busiest months of the year. More reason to rest. If you can't find rest on the outside, find ways to rest on the inside. What are you waiting for?
