WELCOME TO OLD SAINT MARY'S CATHEDRAL

IF I GET TO HEAVEN, I DON'T WANT TO SEE GOD A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FR. JOE SCOTT

If I get to heaven, I don't want to see God there.

Let me explain. My first image of God, from the old catechism, was a drawing called "the Beatific Vision." It pictured God as an old white man with a long white beard, sitting on a grand throne, and attended by angels acting as His servants.

I'm not that interested in seeing him. I don't want St. Peter greeting me at the Pearly Gates either.

If I get to heaven, I want to be welcomed by Mary Magdalene. I see Mary Magdalene as someone just filled with the kind of love that can endure any obstacle. She was the only one to greet Jesus when he rose from the dead. None of the other apostles were there, including Peter. I want to be greeted by someone filled with that much love.

After the Magdalene, I want to see all those whom I have loved and who have loved me and taught me, sometimes painfully, how to love. I want to see them because I want to give thanks to each one of them. There are so many whose love I took for granted in my life, and I have so much for which to be thankful.

Next, I need to see those whom I need to forgive, and especially those from whom I need to ask forgiveness. Those whose hearts I hurt, because they loved me more than my heart could bear.

For this, I need Peter-no, not St. Peter, but Sinner Peter. Peter knew what it was like to shed tears over his failure to love. I've shed my share of tears over my foolish hardness of heart, and I want my fellow sinner Peter to be there with me to teach me how to forgive and how to accept the forgiveness I don't deserve, but for which I still hope.

Finally, I need to face my enemies, those I never did like and those who never did like me. To be truthful, even now, I honestly don't want their forgiveness, and I'm sure not ready to forgive them.

For this, I need Jesus. I need the Jesus who tells me: "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you." Even more importantly, I need the Jesus who was surrounded by enemies on the cross, folks who were laughing at him, making fun of his suffering and death, and of his helplessness, and with his dying breath, he forgave every one of them. Jesus, I truly NEED you for this one!

If they do let me pass through those Pearly Gates, I'm still not sure if I want to see that old white man presiding over heaven on his grand throne. But I, and we, must be open to surprises!
