THE SINS OF GOOD PEOPLE

A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FR. JOE SCOTT



Have you read the gospel story where Jesus scolds the prostitute for her scandalous behavior? You haven't? That's because there's no such story in any of the four gospels!

Jesus is surprisingly uninterested in sexual sins. Now, Jesus DOES hold up, and very clearly, the value of a marriage that creates a union of loving, co-equal and faithful partners. He believed that a lasting union was a powerful sign on earth of the faithfulness of God to us, which is why we call marriage a Sacrament.

Other than this, Jesus doesn't seem to be much interested in sex. The Church has often repaid his inattention by becoming obsessively interested in sex.

We need to realize that justice and mercy are meant to characterize our sexual lives no more and no less than is the case with any other relationship, attitude, or decision. We're called to treat people decently. That means not ruining our lives or other people's lives by our own selfishness. We do unto others as we would have them do to us. If we treat people decently, we'll do okay.

Jesus is much more interested in the sins of good people. Like the Pharisee who compared himself with a satisfied heart to the wretched tax-collector. Like us. Like people who go to church each Sunday and gravitate toward the seat that we consider OURS. Dirty looks across the pew do not create community!

A few years ago, a late-night television comedian invented a character called **"the Church lady."** Everyone laughed because everyone recognized her. She's real! We all have come across her, in one Church or another. The television character was prideful, self-righteous, overflowing with judgments and gossip. Our first task as Church going people is to not be "the Church lady!"

There is a reason why we also remember Jesus' parable about the Pharisee and the Tax Collector so well. The Jews of Jesus time believed that there were two prayers appropriate to offer when you went to the Temple. First, gratitude for the blessings God has bestowed. Then, placing before God with confidence our needs along with the needs of others we know or don't know.

The Pharisee in Jesus' story does neither. He spends most of his time in the Temple bragging to God about all the good he has done. He DOES notice the tax-collector, but only as an example of a sinner unlike himself. His recognition does not evoke compassion, and therefore does not bring communion.

The tax-collector's sin is public and so his broken heart. This is a man as desperate for the mercy of God as a drowning swimmer is for a breath of air. He might be comforted at least a bit for the kindness of another human being, even a stranger.

The Pharisee, in fact, sees this anguished man as someone to stay away from. How often have we discovered a person alone in a dark Church when prayers have swelled into sobs, and discreetly crept away?

The tax-collector leaves the Temple in the arms of God because his broken heart is broken open, now tender to welcome and savor God's love. The Pharisee goes home having wasted his time. This Pharisee is a VERY good man, but God waits patiently for the day HIS heart will be broken. Jesus reminds us that the greatest sin of all is being satisfied with a heart too small to love.
