#### Notes from the Paulist

#### CAN ONLY A PRIEST OFFER A BLESSING? (OR MORE ON BEING STINGY WITH GOD'S GIFTS)

A precise answer is that only God can offer a blessing. Only the Creator can bless creation.

The Old Testament patriarchs, however, believed that God had delegated them the power to bless their offspring. They took this seriously and with imagination. Jacob's blessings for each of his twelve sons showed that he took time to think about the kind of blessing that would be appropriate for each son.

The idea of priests having a special responsibility for blessing goes back to the Old Testament: the priestly class and the seasonal blessings of "first fruits" at each harvest. But priests would not be present at every Passover, so the head of the household took on the role of calling upon God's blessing. Our custom of offering a blessing before we eat dates back to this Jewish tradition.

The special blessing offered by the pope is called "to the city and the world." A newly elected bishop of Rome offers this blessing for the first time on the balcony before the crowd below gathered for that purpose. Pope Francis changed this century's old tradition when he bowed his head and asked the people of God to bless HIM. This was not just a charming touch. He was acknowledging that God's power to bless can be offered by anyone, by reason of his or her humanness.

On occasion, a family has invited me to visit their home and offer a blessing to bring grace to their new life in this new place. In more recent years, I try to invite the members of the family to offer their own blessings as well. Who better to ask God's blessing for a home than the folks who will actually be living there! Who can know what moments of tenderness and affection these walls will witness, or what words or anger or bitterness will threaten to tear these walls down? How appropriate that at the very beginning of their life here, every man, woman has a chance to place in God's hands the house they must fashion into home.

As Catholics, we tend to invest in a priest the sole responsibility for spiritual gifts that we ourselves possess. Despite his impressive vestments, the priest does not "marry" the couple at a wedding. The couple marry each other by the exchange of vows. The priest does offer a blessing to the newly wed on behalf of the Church and the gathered family.

How does God forgive sin? By means of the penitent's confession, or through the absolution of the priest? We might think it's the absolution. But the most influential theologian St Thomas Aquinas wrote that: In the absence of one's own priest, confession may be made even to a layperson, because the act of confessing is more important than the person to whom the confession is made."

Perhaps the most profound confessions we remember are those we made to another person against whom we have sinned. And the most profound forgiveness we may experience is offered by the person whose heart we have broken. Does a priest need to be there for it to be a sacrament?

We might think about ways we can best make use of the power to bless that God has given us. Parents or grandparents have a great opportunity to bless their children or grandchildren on a birthday or a graduation. Think of the blessings Mary and Elizabeth gave to one another—one very old, one very young, but each facing the risks and the mysteries of birthing a child.

The blessing of a friend or friends can mean so much when we are experiencing a divorce or the loss of a beloved person. In what ways would you like to offer a blessing to a friend? It can be as profound as a poem or as simple as a hug. God has given you this gift of blessing so you can offer it to someone who really needs it or someone who doesn't know he or she needs it. We will never regret an important word we have spoken to another, but we will regret words we yearned to share but left unsaid.
