MERCY IS WHAT GOD IS ALL ABOUT!

A Reflection by Paulist Father Joe Scott

The Sunday after Easter has often been called, at least by parish priests, "Low Sunday." It was something of a name of shame, referring to the fact that this Sunday has often brought the lowest Church attendance of the year. It was as though those who regularly attend Mass each Sunday decided to compensate for the way above average crowds of Easter.

St. John Paul II, however, named this "Divine Mercy Sunday", gifting us with a much more fruitful theme for reflection. There seem to be at least three different ways in which we human beings approach God:



There are some people who believe that God is angry at us most of the time, and chiefly interested in punishing us for our sins, particularly sexually related sins. These poor folk spend much of their lives in misery because they can't forgive themselves and seem to find it impossible to believe in a God who would forgive them.

Then there are those who believe that God simply doesn't care about us one way of the other. Perhaps God doesn't exist or does exist but is indifferent to us and unconcerned about our faith. These two beliefs are basically the same. If God doesn't care, then God doesn't exist.

Neither of these presents Jesus' way of understanding God. In Jesus' teaching, God is love, compassion and mercy. The author of the First Letter of John states it clearly: "God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God, and God in him" (*I John 4:16*).

This means that the universe runs on love.

Walter Cardinal Kasper, in his book on *Mercy: The Essence of the Gospel and the Key to Christian Life* (published by Paulist Press) notes that "to believe in love and to make love the embodiment and sum of our understanding of existence has far reaching, indeed revolutionary consequences for our image of God, of our self-understanding...and for our conduct in the world."

There is no question at all that we receive God's mercy. The only question is whether we choose to accept it. To accept it we must open our hearts to share OUR mercy and forgiveness with those who have hurt us. When our hearts open toward those who need our mercy, we can trust that God always finds a way to make a home in an open heart. And that's heaven!
