JESUS IS NOT A CULTURE WARRIOR!

The term **"culture warrior"** is `heard a lot these days applied to the Catholic Church. Some Catholics, bishops too, even claim this title proudly. But I don't like it! Jesus never applied the word "warrior" to himself. Jesus DID say "those who live by the sword will die by the sword."

My family includes men and women who have served in the military during war time. People who have served their country in war deserve our respect. But not everyone who calls himself a "warrior" is worth listening to!

I've learned that the good soldier serves to protect and defend. Professional soldiers are the very last ones itching to go to war.

To use a very recent example of good solider strength, we can be proud of our American soldiers who, at constant risk to their own lives, rescued men and women and yes, children and babies, seeking refuge after the collapse of the government in Afghanistan.

But Jesus calls us to compassion, and we can't be compassionate without tenderness in our hearts! Strength without compassion can easily become foolishness bent on destruction, not wisdom seeking the peace that Jesus wants for us. And compassion can be easily lost, when we are driven by anger!

There are many things about our American culture that we should all, as Christians, be concerned about, and work to change.

-- our adulation of the rich and famous, which makes us pay movie stars and football players a whole lot more money than we pay teachers and social workers.

-- our racism and distrust of intelligent women, which fills our Congress and Supreme Court with rich white men confident about getting their own way.

-- our love of guns and violence, which gives us a mass murder somewhere in our country, every day--- yes, every day.

-- our addiction to internet pornography, which teaches young men to assault young women and attempts to persuade young women that they just must accept this as part of who men are.

Honestly, I would welcome a sex tape that taught couples how to have fun, while, at the same time helped them to be truly loving and respectful of one another's dignity, and looking out for one another's best self. It won't happen, because it won't sell. Big money is what internet pornography is all about!

So yes, there is much in our American culture we need to be concerned about and find ways to challenge and leaven with the gospel of Jesus.

But after 200 years or so as American Catholics, we've not succeeded in making our secular culture interested in Jesus---I mean the REAL Jesus we can actually read about in the gospels. In many ways, we've joined the secular parade!

One thing is guaranteed—we will not convert America with our anger.

Jesus never says: make as many enemies as you can, with your neighbors and even with your own family members, with your warrior-like certainty about always being right. In fact, the very thing Jesus gets angry about, in those gospel stories, is self-righteousness.

Jesus has a plan for us that we might profitably share with our American culture. He says: "be compassionate, as your heavenly Father is compassionate." He says: "love your enemy and pray for those who persecute you."

Can we do it? Can we bring THIS to our culture?
