
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PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

OLD SAINT MARY'S, built in 1854 as California's first Cathedral,

was the first Cathedral to be named in honor of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. The Paulist Fathers were given Pastoral responsibilities of Old St. Mary's in 1894 and have faithfully ministered to the people of Chinatown, Nob Hill and the Financial District ever since. A Survivor of the 1906 earthquake and fire, this major historical landmark has been retrofitted to



meet new seismic codes; however, we must now comply with the American Disability Act and refurbish the interior of this beautiful old cathedral. Notes from the Paulist

SISTER THEA BOWMAN (1937-1990): A VOICE FOR JUSTICE AND JOY



Bertha Bowman was born in rural Mississippi. While attending a Catholic school, she was baptized at age ten. Her religious awakening began when her parents enrolled her in a new school run by the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. She fell in love with the work of the Sisters, joined the convent when she was 16, and by custom took a new name indicating her new vocation, Thea ("of God.")

She was the only Black face in the religious order she joined but her keen intelligence and love of God helped her to evolve a very successful ministry, seeking a uniquely Black way of being Catholic.

After she had earned her doctorate in English, her life became a busy round of University teaching, lecturing and giving retreats. In 1980 she helped found the Institute for Black Catholic Studies at St. Francis Xavier University in New Orleans. But she was not a solitary scholar wedded to the classroom. Everyone she met learned that she was full of life. She taught young Black students to rediscover the traditions of gospel music and dance. She taught not only by words but by dancing joyful song.

In her own words, "what does it mean to be Black and Catholic? It means that I come to my church fully functioning. I bring myself, my black self, all that I am, all that I have, all that I hope to become. I bring my whole history, my traditions, my vulture, my African American song and dance and gesture and movement and teaching and preaching and healing and responsibility as a gift to the church."

In 1984 Sister Thea learned that she had terminal cancer. She died in 1990 at 53 years of age. Although she became wheelchair bound and no longer able to dance, her work continued, and so did her joy.

More words from Sister Thea:

"I think the difference between me and some people is that I'm content to do my little bit. Sometimes people think they have to do big things in order to make change. But if each one would light a candle we'd have a tremendous light."

"I know that suffering gives us new perspectives and helps us to clarify our real value. I know that suffering has helped me to clarify my relationships. Perhaps suffering stops us in our tracks and forces us to confront what is real within ourselves and in our environment."

"I try to make sense of life. I try to keep myself open to people and to laughter and to love and to have faith."

"Part of my approach to my illness has been to say I want to choose life, I want to keep going, I want to live fully until I die."

Sister Thea Bowman has been declared a "Servant of God" by the Catholic Church, the first step toward becoming a saint. There are many books written about her, including a Paulist Press biography "Sister Thea Bowman: Do You Hear Me, Church?" authored by Peggy A. Sklar.
